Fonts are a lot like people! They come in all different shapes and sizes, have names, personalities and can be part of a family of fonts!

Here are some of the basic distinguishing features of fonts, and how we begin to categorize them.



serif fonts contain 'serifs' on the ends of the letters

# Slab Serif

slab serif fonts contain 'serifs' that are flat, without any curve -


## Sans Serif

sans (meaning without) serif fonts do not have anything on the ends of the letters


script fonts are in cursive lettering.

#### DSPLIT

—display fonts are the crazy ones that don't have to fit any restrictions! they are great for headlines, but hard to read in a paragraph.
